

- Just a reminder: fill out those U.S. Census forms and mail them back as soon as possible! .
 The 2010 Census documents the changes in our nation over the last 10 years. Census data affect how more than \$400 billion in federal funding is distributed to tribal, state, and local governments, framing our communities for the next 10 years. GFWC uses Census data to determine what parts of our communities have the greatest need and assists with crafting resolutions. (from GFWC News and Notes email)
 - It's easy. The 2010 Census form asks 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. One form is required per household. The primary homeowner or renter should complete the form on behalf of every person residing in the household, both relatives and nonrelatives.
 - It's important. Census data are used to reapportion seats in Congress and ensure proper district representation in state and local governments. Information from the census helps determine locations for child-care and senior centers, new roads, hospitals, and schools.
 - It's safe. By law, the U.S. Census Bureau cannot share respondents' answers with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.
