Monday March 11thBusiness Meeting: There was an installation of a new member, Kathleen



Sampson by membership chairman Joyce Clark. Club members celebrated March as Women's History Month by introducing a short biography on Gerda Lerner, known as the 'Mother' of Women's

History Month presented by Nancy Brown, Women's History and Resource chairman. Gerda Lerner was a remarkable public intellectual and life-long activist. A member of JWA's Academic Advisory Council, she was enthusiastic about chronicling and transmitting the history of Jewish women. No historian was more identified with the field of women's history. Receiving her Ph.D. at the age of 46, she wrote a series of groundbreaking books in which she almost singlehandedly created a conceptual framework for the field. Her leadership extended beyond theory to practice: she institutionalized women's history when she created the nation's first graduate program in the field at Sarah Lawrence College and played a major role in making women's history a subject of interest to the general public. The idea for Women's History Week (now the popular Women's History Month) grew out of an institute she organized in 1979.

"Women's history is women's right," she said, "an essential, indispensable heritage from which we can draw pride, comfort, courage, and long range vision."

The program this month was given



by guest Mary Njeri who spoke about her life in Kenya before coming to the United States.

What we did this month: In honor of Dr. Seuss's 115th birthday, member Nancy Brown, AKA *The Cat in the Hat,* along with Education Chairwoman Nancy Martin, visited Triumph Head Start in Taunton on Friday, March 1st. The Cat in the Hat story was read to a crowd of over 100 preschoolers in three groups for twenty minutes each. During each reading of *The Cat in Hat* book one child was asked to flip pages and one to assist in the

capturing of Thing 1 and Thing 2.



When Thing 1 and Thing 2 made an appearance they were

brought around the room to shake hands with the children. The







children were very responsive to the reading and each child was given a coloring page and either a Cat in the Hat or Thing 1 & 2 hat. As they exited the room, each child was given the option of shaking hands with The Cat in the

Hat. The Taunton and Raynham Juniors also donated five Dr. Seuss books along with a stuffed Cat in the Hat to the school. On the same day Mrs. Brown as the Cat also visited E.F. Leddy Pre-School in Taunton. She sang Happy Birthday with



each group, and Leddy Librarian Audrey Serrecchia, a former club member, joined in on the sing along.



She finished her visit by reading The Cat in the Hat to Mrs. Cocoran's class.
