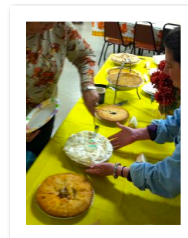
Our club donated food items for our Thanksgiving Basket that was delivered by Dolores Costa to St. Vincent DePaul for those less fortunate than us.

THELMA'S EARLY YEARS

Thelma Elizabeth Peirce is the wisest and eldest of 8 siblings born in the 1920's. She lived through the Great Depression with her family in East Taunton. They had chickens, pigs and Golden Gurnsey cows.



Her father would milk the cows and the milk would then be put into a milk separator which the

skim milk would be filtered through one spigot and the cream through another. The children would be served the skim milk as would the pigs

and when it curdled it was given to the cows. They sold the cream. Thelma was



responsible for washing the 47 disks in the milk separator and the milk bottles.

Thelma has the family milk separator from her youth and it now serves as a pedestal for her house plants.

After graduating from Taunton High School,



Thelma went to work at the Carol Cut-Rate cosmetic store in downtown Taunton.

Thelma and her girlfriends would frequent the Wampanoag Room (the 2nd floor in what is now Pub 76) on Saturday nights; drink wine and listen to Ray Jones play the piano and sing. He sang songs like 'O Dear What Can The Matter Be?' and customize the lyrics to those young ladies who came to listen to him.

THELMA'S FAMILY

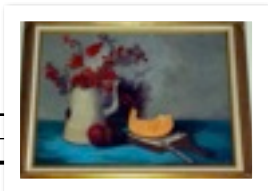
It was at the Wampanoag Room that Thelma met Bill McCaffrey who was serving in the US Air Force during WWII. Bill became an accountant and was known for his great sense of humor. They married on July 3, 1948 and have 4 children; Cheryl,

Billy, Chuckie and Shawna and 7 grandchildren. Bill passed away in 2004.

Juniors' Committees - What Do They Do?

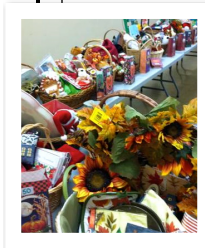
There are 7 Standing Club Committees: Ways & Means, Programs, Newsletter, Yearbook, Hospitality, Sunshine and Publicity.
