
December 5th Business Meeting: Our invited guests were first Robin Bryant from the Taunton

Matthew Mission for Christmas from items collected through the months of October to December by members. Our president Lynne Jorge delivered them to the mission.

The Prison Book has thanked our club along with many others for the contributions we have made both in time and books. They have expressed their gratitude to the donors, volunteers and friends of the Prison Book Program. The Program sent approximately 31,000 books to 12,384 people in prison. That's an almost 50% increase since 2013; 923 people came to Quincy on their own or

with one of 45 service groups. They volunteered 6,713 hours in 2,553 shifts to pick, pack and sort those books. They were able to improve the quality of services to prisoners. The vast majority of those who asked for a GED Study Guide or dictionary got one. Prisoners' requests are now filled within 4-6 weeks – down from 4-6 months a few years ago. The year of 2016 brought the dawn of a political climate that threatens to dramatically increase the number of people housed in America's prisons. Now, more than ever, they remain committed to meeting the needs of the people who ask us for books, no matter how many ask. Edith Edlund and Cindy Brogan brought \$126 of clothing from the Flower Power fundraiser to purchase sweatshirts, sweatpants and slippers for the female veterans at the VA Hospital.

Cindy Brogan a female veteran donated the \$75 needed to rent the VFW Hall for our next event.

Monday December 12th: Was our annual club Christmas party. The event took place at the Boston Tavern in Middleboro from 6:00pm to 9:00pm. The




