February Meeting: Our guest speakers were Phillip Duarte and James Le Frame. The Pathways Initiative started in January 2017. The goal is to establish multi-use paths along the Taunton/Dighton River that can be used by walkers, bikers, and runners. The Friends of the Taunton Pathways, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization created to aid the mission and goals of the Taunton Pathways Committee. They are working together to improve bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure in Taunton and surrounding communities in order to promote a healthier and safer community for residents and



visitors of all ages and abilities. In 2017, its first year in existence, the Taunton Pathways Committee accomplished a great deal: they established long-term partnerships with Mass in Motion and SRPEDD, created detailed maps of the Taunton

River Trail route and potential phases, met with various elected officials and department heads to update them on their plans, conducted a walkthrough of part of the route with Mayor Hoye and the City Engineer, applied for and received a \$1500 grant from the Taunton River Stewardship Council, assisted Mass in Motion in creating a Walking Brochure for the City of Taunton, established a significant social media presence,

Tabled at events hosted by other organizations, Hosted their own events, participated extensively in the Master Plan process, attended conferences, conducted a Community Bike and Pedestrian Survey, and established the Friends of the Taunton Pathways, Inc.. In addition to running the Silver City Farmers' Market, Mass in Motion has also conducted walking audits to establish safe walking routes in Taunton, and it facilitates the Bristol Commons Community Garden. Mass in Motion Taunton is a proud sponsor of Taunton Pathways. The speakers feel if they could get community

organizations to form committees and utilize the pathways in support of its' continued growth, they could gain more money in the form of grants. Our



club has decided that starting in April we will attempt to organize a day each month to walk as a club in this endeavor. The club donated a check to help with their endeavor for \$100.

Members were asked to wear red clothing to our business meeting to support American Heart Month, where the nation comes together, igniting

a wave of red from coast to coast. This annual groundswell unites millions of people for a common



goal: the eradication of heart disease and stroke. The club voted to donate \$60 to the support the animal rescue league which in turn will use the money to buy one dozen roses for nursing home residents for Valentine's Day.

ADVOCATES FOR CHILDREN: White Ribbon Day is March 1st, first Thursday in March. White Ribbon Campaign was created by a handful of Canadian

men in 1991 on the second anniversary of one man's massacre of 14 women in Montreal. They began the White Ribbon Campaign to urge men to speak out against violence against women. It is the largest effort in the world of men working to end men's violence against women. It relies on volunteer support and financial contributions from individuals and organizations. After only six weeks preparation, more than one hundred thousand men across Canada wore a white ribbon. Many others were drawn into discussion and debate on the issue of men's violence. Brett Ploude Memorial **Fund** is hosting its 4th Annual Talent Showcase on Saturday April 13th, All proceeds will go to support efforts to combat teen/youth suicide and depression and to promote the study of technology.
