

Homes for troops is topic

TAUNTON - The GFWC Taunton and Raynham Junior Woman's Club hosted guest speaker Stephen Keohane, who is the Director of Development for Homes for Our Toops, at their recent monthly meeting.

He spoke on behalf of John Gonsalves who was unable to attend. Homes for Our Troops was founded by John Gonsalves. Before founding Home for Our Troops Mr. Gonsalves had 20 years of construction experience.

As it did for many of us, September 11th changed his life. After hearing on the news about our soldiers returning from the war with severe brain injury or loss of arms, legs or vision, John

wondered how these men and women would get around in the comfort of their homes. He found that most of them could not afford to own their own homes and most houses and apartments are not easily adapted to take into consideration their types of injuries.

John decided to do something about this by founding Homes for Our Troops, based in Taunton. His foundation has completed over 30 specially adapted homes for disabled veterans and has as many in progress.

At the meeting, Stephen Keohane explained how the organization works in providing safe and handicap accessible and adapted housing for the veterans. The club gave a hundred dollar donation to Homes for Our Troops.
