Tackling Domestic Violence

GFWC and International President Babs J. Condon, along with more than 2,100 organizations throughout the country, have signed the NFL Game Changer letter. Submitted to NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell, the letter asks that the NFL develop policies and protocols that make clear that the League does not tolerate violence against women and girls.

The letter acknowledges the steps the NFL has recently taken to increase awareness of domestic violence and sexual assault, while calling upon the league to partner with state and local experts to engage communities in a cultural transformation that ends violence against women and girls through prevention and education, and engaging men and boys.
