
for allowing us to participate in these movie events.

Officer Pacheco has a 4 year old black German Shepherd, Kyro and Diane a black lab, Quinn, a trained cadaver sniffing dog who will model 2 varieties of canine vests. Both handlers and dogs have gone through extensive training. Although the vests alone are expensive - approximately \$2500 each, the entire training process, first aid packs, air conditioned/heated vehicle crates, etc., can cost anywhere from \$6,000-\$10,000.
