

From Your editor: One in three teens in the U.S. will experience physical, sexual, or emotional abuse by someone they are in a relationship with before they become adults and nearly half of college women report experiencing violent and abusive dating behaviors. You can help spread awareness and do your part to stop dating abuse before it starts by wearing orange ribbons through February and March, months that represent teen dating and self-injury awareness months. Many of these teens resort to self-harm which is most common between the ages of 12 and 24, 80% of self-harm involves stabbing or cutting the skin with a sharp object. Talk to your children and grandchildren about these topics.
