Raynham. Tickets are now available for \$12 through members or by calling Denise at 508 813-7392. Gift cards for raffle prizes are needed.



It is a coping mechanism to provide temporary relief of intense feelings of anxiety, depression, stress, emotional numbness or sense of failure. It is most common between the ages of 12 to 24.
