




and was able to order from the regular menu. The scholarship recipients were announced to the membership.

Update from the Prison Book Program: An email received by the Education Chairman stated that as of July 20, PBP had filled 8,870 orders from incarcerated readers, keeping on pace to meet their ambitious goal of sending 15,000 book packages in 2022. As always, this is 100% attributable to the enthusiastic, committed volunteers who attend the sessions and to the incredibly generous supporters who donate books and money to keep them going. THANK YOU! The COVID-19 backlog is gone! Requests from July are being picked now. Most requestors are getting their books within 60 days of requesting them. PBP has recently become an approved sender of books to 13 new federal prisons: 5 in California, 2 in Illinois, 1 in Michigan, and 5 in Texas. This is due to super-volunteer Mike Wood's diligent efforts. They can now say that PBP serve 49 states. Volunteer-led efforts to update and expand the National Prisoner Resource List have come to fruition! Thanks to Theresa Lam and Jonathan Wong, who painstakingly looked up every listing in the previous NPRL and corrected and updated each one, and especially to Julie Streeter, who reformatted the NPRL in Microsoft Publisher and added art, Sudoku's and many new resources! The NPRL has grown from 8 to 12 pages; all chock full of great supports for people in prison and their loved ones.
