June- June Social- Took place on June 4th at Lorenzo's



His mother stood in the back in case he faltered or had trouble answering questions. He struggles every day to not allow anyone to see him as different but as a person. What I got from his speech was "do not be afraid of me", "give me a reason to trust you", "remember I am human with feelings just like you." It took a great deal of courage for this young man to step up to that microphone and speak to us but I am glad he did. They had a great time, felt it was a fun, invigorating and an informative event.

Friday June 15th-16th Relay for Life – Once again our club sponsored a table at Relay for Life. It was organized by Denise Wheeler. There was a raffle and a children roll up game. 
