She is still going to check in with them for needs but hopes to adopt a new program: TACT (Taunton Area Community Table) located on Bay Street in Taunton. They serve food on Thursdays to families in need. In light of this: membership approved the purchase of 24 red aprons that will have our

logo printed on them by Bristol Plymouth. They will be ready for the May meeting. Members have received their grey shirts with our logo imprinted on them to wear at events: that started at the club sponsored Bingo! Thanks to Nancy Brown. Denise again collected items and shared recycled items with the membership. Health and Wellness Chairman, Ana Kearnan shared information about water intake: drink water instead of food if you feel hungry and sip water between bites as you eat



and start your day with water not coffee. She donated three bottles of water for each table with an attached paper reminding members

how much water they should drink every day. She also collected and donated to New Hope Diversity group 10 packs of maxi pads. Cindy Brogan shared the design by Nancy Clark for our banner at the East Taunton Little League. Emily Weiland collected 8 lbs of sugar, flour, pancake mixes and syrup, oatmeal and a whole bag of soaps and feminine hygiene products to the **Food Pantry**.
