WOMENS HISTORY AND RESOURCE CENTER-

Nancy Brown – Alcoholics Anonymous began in 1935 in Akron, Ohio, as the outcome of a meeting between Bill Wilson, a New York stockbroker and Dr. Bob S., an Akron surgeon. Both had been hopeless alcoholics. The woman behind one of them, Lois Wilson, Bill's Wilson's wife is who thisis about. There are few people who better epitomize the sentiments of the Tammy Wynette country classic "Stand by Your Man", than Lois Wilson. As the founder of Al-Anon she is lovingly remembered by hundreds of thousands, or more, who have seen loved ones recover, or have, at least, been comforted, and guided, in their times of struggle. Had Lois enjoyed the strength and independent spirit of her mother-in-law, Emily, she might well have, in saving herself, adversely affected millions to come. Without her persistence and seemingly limitless devotion, it is unlikely that her husband would have gotten and stayed sober. Devoid of her financial and moral support, he would surely have been unable to dedicate himself to the cause of saving others, and to pursue with single-minded dedication his far-reaching dreams. You can read more about this woman's journey in 'When Love is Not Enough', The Lois Wilson Story on Wikipedia, during a time when men still ruled, yet she persevered in standing by her man, neglecting her own needs. She finally began a Treatment Center for women as alcoholism knows no gender.
